IN MEMORIAM -

DAVID K. GORDON, artist and awardwinning art director, died in 2018, at the age of 87. He studied at Cranbrook Academy of Art. From 2001 through 2004, David showed at Tatistcheff Gallery in New York. His first show of pastels there resulted in a major article in Pastel Journal. Other exhibitions included Spencertown Academy of Art in 2008 and Quick Center for the Arts in 2009. He was a member of the Society of American Graphic Artists. From 2009 David exhibited at Prince Street Gallery and was the principal designer for the gallery's postcards and newsletters. A native New Yorker, David used his observations of life in the city as the inspiration for his art. Prince Street Gallery held the "David K Gordon Memorial Exhibition" in August 2018 featuring his recent work in oils, prints, and pastels.

ARTHUR ELIAS, 92, was a realist painter, who died in April of this year. After serving in World War II, Arthur attended Carnegie Institute of Technology. After his first year there, he shared a studio in a Victorian barn in Pittsburgh with fellow students Philip Pearlstein, Dorothy Kantor, John Regan, and Andy Warhol. After earning his Master's degree from the University of Pittsburgh, he and his wife moved to Paris to begin his professional life as an artist. As the center of the art world shifted to the United States, he left Paris to move to New York City. In 1972, three of his paintings were featured in "22 Realists" at the Whitney Museum. Over the years, Elias showed at a number of New York galleries, including Forum and Peridot, and most recently at Prince Street Gallery.

Juror **ROBERT BIRMELIN**, selected 40 works for exhibit in the gallery's 10th Annual National Juried Show in July. Birmelin gave a talk on his work in conjunction with the exhibit.

MICHEL TOMBELAINE passed away in 2017 at the age of 92. Born in France, he graduated from the Sorbonne in Paris in 1945 with degrees in political science and law. Before joining Prince Street Gallery, Michel served as a United Nations journalist and diplomat, from 1952 to the early 1970s. In 1961, Michel served as UN Secretary General Dag Hammarskjold's Representative in the break-away Congo province of Katanga. He narrowly escaped with his life on three occasions, the most striking when, at the last moment, he did not board the plane in which Hammarskjold and all on board were killed. In the 1970's he gave up this career to move to New York and to pursue his art. He later studied at the New York Studio School and the International School of Painting in Umbria, Italy.
